Installation requirements

- Install in accordance with Advance Flooring, Installation Instructions Symphony2
- Recommended to be installed with an Advance Flooring Matwell surround frame.
- After frame installation, prepare substrate base to suit level of matting and to provide a smooth, level base.

Maintenance requirements

- Maintenance to be in accordance with Advance Flooring, Maintenance Instructions Advance Entrance Matting Systems.
- Daily maintenance soiling removed with vacuum cleaner. Chewing gum to be removed as soon as it appears by use of specialist products.
- Periodic maintenance carry-out routine visual inspection to identify when matting is becoming full of dirt. Clean using water spray extraction method. Can be scrubbed by machine or hand along direction of infills. For staining, household solvents may be used to manufacturer's instructions. Only used solvents applied with a rag, do not pour solvent onto matting.
- The matting can be removed from the well and sprayed with a medium pressure water machine.
- If inserts are damaged or unduly worn, they can be replaced.
